He shipped it back to Europe and went into business for himself. He rented a shop in San Antonio, which he later bought, expanded to the mainland and enjoyed the fruits of his business acumen. "Although I am not money-minded I accept that life is business, exchanging ideas, selling yourself and your ideas is all part of it. My university training helped me a lot." Coming from three generations of antique dealers, it was a natural thing for Bernard to turn his hand to.

Another of his ventures is the voluntary non-profit making scheme. *El Plan*, where people in the community trade their skills and services; the Green Money Alternative.

During his childhood Bernard was weak and sickly. This put his parents through hell, a lot of money and many different doctors - all of whom offered treatments but not cures - in his late teens, he looked for alternative methods of health, this meant changing his diet and stopping all medication. He became a follower of the Maharishi (Guru to the Beatles, Mia Farrow, Clint Eastwood). He trained to become an instructor and was sent to Tunisia and Morocco to carry on the teachings. "This opened up a new way of life for me: preaching yoga, healthy food (no meat), becoming spiritually aware. All of this is a life long process, which has led me to Sai Baba. I am not claiming to be perfect, that takes a

while to achieve.' This friendly, open, witty man who has had a few love stories scattered through his life remains a child-free (as far as he knows) bachelor, content with and never bored by his own company. -The lesson here is first be happy with yourself, then who knows what will follow. Ambitions? Yes, but not in the general sense of the word. I am not looking for recognition, life is too precious. I believe that when we are born our life plan is already set out (Dharma). If one can become aware of and fulfill this plan, by being in the right place at the right time, and by doing what is right for yourself, then it is possible to achieve.
